Social Value of Government Research and Public Announcement \sim Acquiring precise information or telling clearly? \sim

Abstract

We consider the welfare effect of the government research and public announcement in a wide class of coordination games with dispersed information. To this end, we generalize the information structure in the coordination game with dispersed information developed by Angeletos and Pavan(2007, *Econometrica*) to that used in Myatt and Wallace(2008). We show that, at least in a special case of payoff structure which is developed by Morris and Shin(2002, *American Economic Review*), the best research effort as possible and a somewhat "ambiguous" announcement maximize social welfare.
