LEXICOGRAPHIC SON PREFENCE IN VIETNAM

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Abstract: Using Vietnamese Household Living Standard Survey 2006, the paper examines

lexicographic son preference, a type of gender preference when parents prefer at least one son

regardless number of daughters. The research suggests that lexicographic son preference remains

its significance in Vietnam. More specifically, it is one son preference. Without son, mothers are

under substantial pressure of having next child at the earliest time. In contrast, families with at

least one son do not take the current sex composition of their children into the decision of both

fertility timing and family size.
