Declaration-based Subsidy and

Contextually Induced Truth-telling *

Abstract

We shall prove the existence of such a situation that we can trust a person's

declaration for political subsidy without any evidence as it is. In particular,

we shall investigate a government's subsidization program that is intended to

accommodate persons with unverifiable disability with a specific context of dis-

ability. And we show that an open declaration process, i.e. cheap talk that

becomes common knowledge, enables fully accurate transmission of individual

conditions. Some political implications are offered.
