Abstract

International labor migration is one of the important topics in developing countries. However, many of the literatures focus on the situations in host countries and we still need to explore concrete mechanism of migration from the aspects of both of host and sending countries. This paper finds that international labor migration affects not only on migrant’s behaviors but also labor force participation of remained people in the sending country by using the data from the Philippines.
