Crime, Search and Rehabilitation

Abstract

This paper investigates how the social attitude toward ex-offenders affects crime

from the search theoretic viewpoint. We show that the strictest society is the first

best for reducing crime. However, as the second best solution, it is also important

to promote rehabilitation for ex-offenders in a certain case. In such a case, match-

ing in the labor market may be inefficient because of crime. Moreover, under the

Hosios condition, the equilibrium labor market tightness is smaller than the efficient

outcome. Our results raise a new aspect of crime rate difference between regions.
