Daycare Effects on Maternal Employment in Japan:

Abstract

This study utilizes data for 1,792 municipalities in Japan from 2000 to 2010 to estimate the effect of accessibility of licensed nursery schools on employment of mothers with child aged 0-5. We instrument each municipality's quota of licensed nursery schools relative to population aged 0-5 with that municipality's land price to address potential endogeneity concerns. Our findings suggest that the average increase in maternal employment rate resulting from a 10% improvement in accessibility of licensed nursery schools is in the order of 4.%. Around 600,000 of mothers could enter the labor market if municipalities with low nursery school accessibility expanded their daycare capacities.
