Progressive taxation on consumption, endogenous growth and indeterminacy

Abstract

This paper shows that in a standard one-sector AK model of endogenous growth with progressive (regressive) taxation on consumption, the consumption tax depending on income level is related to the local stability properties of the economy's balanced-growth paths. When the tax schedule is progressive (regressive), the economy exhibits an indeterminate balanced-growth equilibrium and belief-driven growth fluctuations. By contrast, when the tax schedule is flat, the economy's balanced-growth path indicates saddle-path stability.
