

Reference-dependent choice: A comprehensive analysis

Abstract

This article provides a comprehensive analysis of two-stage reference-dependent choice procedures where the reference alternative plays its role in generating shortlist in the first stage and preference maximal alternatives are chosen from the shortlist on the second stage. We study and characterize choice procedures with different structures on the shortlisting stage and with different inter-stage structures between first and second stages.
